PROGRAMME NOTE - MO GHILE MEAR

Written by the eighteenth-century poet Seán Clárach Mac Dómhnaill, *Mo Ghile Mear* is a traditional allegorical song—similar to the Gaelic poetic form of the *Aisling*—in which the poet laments the departure of Prince Charles Edward Stuart (Bonnie Prince Charlie). As is customary, the poetic text portrays the land in decline in his absence. The drum used in this arrangement is the Irish single-headed frame drum, the *bodhrán*, but an alternative hand-played frame drum may be used as a substitute.
